

MAY 20, 1993

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, May 20, 1993, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: Mayor Thomas Campbell; Councilmembers Larry Carlson, Melvin Erickson, Joseph Groberg, Linda Milam, Gary Mills, and Ralph Wood. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney; and all available Division Directors. The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of the last Regular Council Meeting held May 6, 1993. The minutes were approved by the Mayor and Councilmembers.

The Mayor declared open a public hearing, as legally advertised, to consider an appeal from a decision of the Board of Adjustment concerning a variance request to allow construction of an oversized garage to accommodate a Home Occupation. He called upon Councilmember Mills to conduct the meeting. At the request of Councilmember Mills, the City Clerk read the following memo:

Attached is a copy of an appeal from a decision of the Board of Adjustment. Mr. and Mrs. Hamberlin requested a variance to allow the construction of an oversized garage to accommodate a Home Occupation. The garage, as requested, would encroach into the rear yard by six feet. The Board of Adjustment denied the request inasmuch as an enlargement to the garage could be done without encroaching into the yard, by redesigning the building. This matter is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for consideration.

The Director of Planning and Zoning located the subject area on a map on the wall and further explained the request.

Councilmember Mills explained the State and City Codes which give the guidelines on which the Council may base their decision on requests for variances. He then invited the requester, David Hamberlin, to further explain his request. Hamberlin said that he and his wife had, just recently, purchased the home at 581 Renny as they needed more area to accommodate the Home Occupation that they operate. He said that he was not aware at the time he purchased the property that there was a twenty-five foot setback requirement. Under the requirement he has two options, namely, attach a garage which requires the variance, or to construct an unattached garage which would be undesirable aesthetically and to his nearby neighbors. He asked the Council to give favorable consideration of his variance request.

Councilmember Erickson registered concern that the Home Occupancy requirements would not be met. Councilmembers made calculations to determine if the requirements could be met. Councilmember Wood stated that he would like to hear from the neighbors of Mr. Hamberlin as to how they feel about this request.

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Councilmember Groberg stated that he is concerned about the variance itself, and the City Ordinance states that a structure cannot be built closer than twenty-five feet in a rear yard, and he cannot see where this request differentiates Mr. Hamberlin from others who may wish to encroach into their yard. He said that there is a difference in want and need.

It was noted that Mr. Hamberlin had not filed a Home Occupancy Permit.

Mr. Burt Kunkel, 605 Renny, appeared briefly to state that, in his opinion, a set back garage would look worse than an attached one. An attached garage is the best option.

Mr. Bob Eddie appeared to state that it appears that there is something wrong with the ordinance if it allows a separate garage and not an attached garage. He said that the Council needs to address the problems in the ordinance.

Mr. LaVar Hudson appeared to state that he has no objection to the proposal. He said that the need is there and it would be in the best interests of the nearby residents to allow this variance request.

Mrs. Nada Eddie appeared to approve this request. She registered concern that an unattached garage would depreciate the value of her property. She asked for Council approval of Mr. Hamberlin's request.

Councilmember Groberg asked the Director of Planning and Zoning to explain the reason for the twenty-five foot requirement.

Planner Gilchrist explained that the major reasons are fire protection and open space requirements. He explained the requirements.

Councilmember Erickson asked Mr. Hamberlin to explain why there had been problems in the past by him parking his trailer on the street. Hamberlin said that there had been a few occasions where complaints were made prior to him pouring the concrete pad where he now parks the trailer.

There being no further comment, it was moved by Councilmember Mills, seconded by Groberg, that this variance request be denied. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmembers Groberg, Mills, and Milam; No, Councilmembers Wood, Carlson, and Erickson. The results of the roll call being a tie, the Mayor voted "No", which granted the variance.

The Director of Planning and Zoning was directed to see that Mr. Hamberlin obtains the required Occupation Permit.

The Mayor then declared open a public hearing to consider an Addendum to the Zoning Ordinance. He asked Councilmember Mills to conduct this hearing. At the request of Councilmember Mills, the City Clerk read the following memo:

The foregoing Ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilmember Mills, seconded by Groberg, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all Ordinances to be fully read on three several days be dispensed with, the question being "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-902 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE FULLY READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmembers Wood, Groberg, Mills, Milam, Carlson, and Erickson; No, none; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and order the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmembers Erickson, Carlson, Milam, Mills, Groberg, and Wood; No, none; carried.

Councilmember Milam explained the need for the budget amendment. It was moved by Councilmember Milam, seconded by Wood, that authorization be given for the publication of the "Notice of Public Hearing" and that the Council tentatively approve the amended 1992-

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1993 Fiscal Year Budget in the amount of \$80,198,673. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmembers Mills, Erickson, Carlson, Wood, Groberg, and Milam; No, none; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilmember Wood, seconded by Mills, that the meeting adjourn at 8:40 P.M.; carried.
