

DECEMBER 5, 1991

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, December 5, 1991, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. Prior to calling the meeting to order, the Mayor called upon Scout Isaac Stewart to come forward and lead all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The Mayor then called the meeting to order and, upon roll, the following were found to be present: Mayor ProTem Melvin Erickson; Councilmen Art Chandler, Wes Deist, Joe Groberg, Sam Sakaguchi, and Ralph Wood. The Mayor was excused as he had open heart surgery on December 4, 1991. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Joe Burgess, Assistant City Attorney, and all available Division Directors. The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of the last Regular Council Meeting held November 21, 1991. The minutes were approved. Eagle Scouts Isaac Stewart, Wade Lowder, and David Wyler were honored.

The Mayor declared open a public hearing, as legally advertised, to consider request to rezone portions of Lots 1 and 2, Block 1, Smith Addition. He called upon Councilman Groberg to conduct the meeting. At the request of Councilman Groberg, the City Clerk read the following memo:

Attached is a copy of a rezoning petition requesting rezoning of the property located at 115 - 165 East Anderson Street from C-1 to HC-1. The Planning Commission considered this matter at a public hearing held in November. No one appeared to object and the Planning Commission recommended approval of the request as submitted.

They recommended that the Comprehensive Plan be changed from multi-family residential to general commercial in this area.

This Department concurs with this recommendation and this matter is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for your consideration.

Director of Planning Gilchrist further explained the request and located the subject area on a map on the wall.

Mr. Brett Manwaring appeared representing Wackerli Realty and Brett Gardner, owner of the property. He explained the request and asked for Council approval.

Councilman Groberg stated that he feels that this is a reasonable request and in keeping with the neighborhood. It was moved by Councilman Groberg, seconded by Chandler, that the Council approve this rezoning request to the Comprehensive Plan and that the rezoning be granted, and that the City Planner be instructed to reflect said amendment and zoning change on the comprehensive plan and official zoning map located in his office. It was noted that a written protest had been received from Lester O. Miller. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Erickson, Deist, and Groberg; No, none; carried.

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Annexation proceedings were then conducted for the Troy Pond property. At the request of Councilman Groberg, the City Clerk read the following memo:

Attached is a copy of the annexation ordinance for the Troy Pond property. This property is owned by the City of Idaho Falls and is being developed as a storm water retention pond. This area will be seeded by grass and a sprinkler system installed. No other development is planned at this time.

The Planning Commission, at the regular meeting in November, considered this matter and at that time, recommended annexation of the property and initial zoning of R-1. This Department concurs with that recommendation and it is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for your consideration.

The Director of Planning located the subject area on a map on the wall and further explained the request.

Mr. Doug Wenzel, 2533 Eldorado, appeared to oppose this annexation. He said that the public treats this area as a park and this adds to traffic, access, noise, and injury problems.

Councilman Deist stated that the City does not intent for this to be a park, but seeding and sprinkling are necessary for erosion problems.

Mr. And Mrs. Dick Schmunk, 310 Troy, both appeared to ask that there be no road to the north end of the pond. Councilman Groberg said that the City has no plans for a road, the owner of the adjoining property may put in a road, but this is unlikely.

There being no one else who wished to speak on this issue, the Mayor closed the hearing.

It was moved by Councilman Groberg, seconded by Chandler, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being "Shall the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully read on three several days be dispensed with?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Groberg, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; No, none; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being "Shall the

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Ordinance Pass?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Groberg, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; No, none; carried.

The Mayor then declared open a public hearing to consider the initial zoning of the newly annexed area. There being no comment, it was moved by Councilman Groberg, seconded by Chandler, that the initial zoning of the newly annexed area be established as R-1 and that the comprehensive plan be amended to include the area annexed herewith, and that the City Planner be instructed to reflect said annexation, zoning, and amendment to the comprehensive plan on the comprehensive plan and zoning maps located in his office.
