

JUNE 18, 1991

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, met in Special Session in the Council Chamber, 140 South Capital Avenue on June 18, 1991 at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of considering all matters that would have been considered on June 20th, but changed due to AIC meetings.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and, upon roll call, the following were found to be present: Mayor ProTem Mel Erickson; Councilmen Wes Deist, Joe Groberg, Art Chandler, and Mel Erickson; Absent, Mayor Tom Campbell, Councilmen Sam Sakaguchi and Ralph Wood. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney; and all available Division Directors.

Mayor ProTem Erickson excused Mayor Campbell and Councilmen Wood and Sakaguchi as they were out of town on City business.

The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of the last Regular Council meeting held June 6, 1991. The minutes were approved.

The Mayor and Councilmembers honored Kathryn Cole, Robyn Franz, Sheri Baker and Korinne Hague for having earned the Girl Scout Silver Award; and Eagle Scouts Erik Cousin and Scott O'Connor.

Annexation proceedings were then conducted for Cedar Ridge Addition, Division No. 7. At the request of Councilman Groberg, the City Clerk read the following memo:

Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Groberg, Chandler, and Erickson; No, none; carried.

1. It is recommended North Boulevard between Crowley and Anderson be posted "SLOW" due to the narrow width of the street and the children from Bush School.

It was moved by Councilman Chandler, seconded by Deist, that this recommendation be approved. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Groberg, Chandler, Erickson, and Deist; No, none; carried.

2. It is recommended both sides of River Parkway, from Broadway to the Westbank Restaurant be posted 2-hour parking from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday due to the increase of people using this area.

Councilman Groberg asked if it would not be a good idea to do the same thing on the east side of the river. Councilman Deist informed the Council that the Committee is presently working on a proposal which will accommodate the Parks and Recreation Department. Councilman Erickson stated that plans are being made for parking around the Court House. Groberg said that he feels that the Traffic Safety Committee should review the possibility of parking spaces on both sides of the river. It was moved by Councilman Chandler, seconded by Deist, that the Council accept the recommendation of the Traffic Safety Committee concerning the west side of the river. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Chandler, Erickson, Deist, and Groberg; No, none; carried.

3. It is recommended the west handicapped parking space on the south side of Constitution Way in front of the Veterans Hall be removed and this space be designated as "Loading-Unloading Only".

It was moved by Councilman Chandler, seconded by Deist, that the Council accept the Traffic Safety recommendation on the loading and unloading zone. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Groberg, Chandler, Erickson, and Deist; No, none; carried.

4. It is recommended the request for a handicap parking space on the southeast corner of Capital Avenue and Constitution Way be denied.

There being no questions, it was moved by Councilman Chandler, seconded by Deist, that this request be denied. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Chandler, Erickson, Deist, and Groberg; No, none; carried.

It was noted that Bill Powell was scheduled for triple bypass surgery the next morning. The Councilmembers wished him "God Speed", and requested that flowers be sent.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Chandler, seconded by Groberg, that the meeting adjourn at 8:30 p.m.; carried.
