

DECEMBER 6, 1990

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, December 6, 1990, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: Mayor Pro-Tem Melvin Erickson, Councilmen Wes Deist, Joe Groberg, Sam Sakaguchi, Ralph Wood, and Art Chandler; Absent: Mayor Tom Campbell. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney and all available Division Directors.

The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of a Special Meeting held November 27, 1990. The minutes were approved by the Mayor and Councilmembers.

The Mayor declared open a public hearing, as legally advertised, to consider a request to re-zone Lots 25, 26, and 27, Highland Park Addition and called upon Councilman Groberg to conduct the hearing. At the request of Councilman Groberg, the City Clerk read the following memo:

Attached is a petition to re-zone Lots 25, 26, and 27, Block 72, Highland Park Addition from R-PA to R-1. The petitioners are requesting the re-zoning in order to operate a home occupation (a beauty shop) on the premises.

The Planning Commission considered this matter at their regular meeting in November, and at that time, several area residents appeared in favor of the request. The Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the re-zoning. This Department concurs with that recommendation and the matter is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for your consideration.

Messrs. Roland Beazer and Don Hill, both area residents, appeared to endorse this re-zoning request. There being no further comment, it was moved by Councilman Groberg, seconded by Chandler, that the zoning of Lots 25, 26, and 27, Block 72, Highland Park Addition be changed from R-PA to R-1, and that the City Planner be instructed to reflect said zoning change on the official zoning map located in his office.
