

AUGUST 23, 1990

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, August 23, 1990, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: Mayor Tom Campbell; Councilmen Wes Deist, Joe Groberg, Sam Sakaguchi, Ralph Wood, Art Chandler, and Mel Erickson. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney and all available Division Directors.

Prior to calling the meeting to order, the Mayor called upon Scout Ronald Orbison to come forward and lead all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of the last Regular Council Meeting held August 9, 1990. The minutes were approved by the Mayor and Councilmembers.

Recommendation No. 7: It is recommended that the request for posting South Woodruff 25 MPH from 17th Street to Sunnyside be denied. There being no one to appear, it was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Chandler, that this

recommendation be upheld and the request denied. Roll as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Groberg, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, and Erickson; No, none; carried.
