

JUNE 7, 1990

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, June 7, 1990, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: Mayor Tom Campbell; Councilmen Ralph Wood, Art Chandler, Wes Deist, Joe Groberg, and Sam Sakaguchi. Absent: Councilman Mel Erickson. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney; and all available Division Directors.

The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of the Special Meeting held May 29, 1990. The minutes were approved.

The Mayor declared open a public hearing, as legally advertised, to consider a request for the establishment of a day care facility at 1165 Bear Avenue. He called upon Councilman Groberg to conduct the hearing. At the request of Councilman Groberg, the City Clerk read the following explanatory memo:

SUBJECT: CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT - DAY CARE CENTER

This Department has received a request for the establishment of a day care facility located at 1165 Bear Avenue. This proposed facility will be located in an existing house and would have a maximum capacity of 23 children. Two (2) staff members will be required. No one will be living at the house. Hours of operation will be 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

This matter was considered at the May meeting of the City Planning Commission, and at that time, an adjacent neighbor voiced some concern inasmuch as she owns two (2) dogs which are kept in her back yard, and the fence separating the two properties is chain link. She was concerned the children in the back yard might reach through the fence and possibly be bitten by the dogs. After some discussion, the Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the request with the condition that the fence separating the two properties be modified or reconstructed to provide a solid fence. This Department concurs with that recommendation and it is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for consideration.

No one appeared either for or against this request. Councilman Sakaguchi asked if the requester would agree to modify the fence as proposed. Director of Planning Gilchrist answered that the requester would modify the fence. Attached is a copy of the final plat, annexation agreement and annexation ordinance for Rose Nielsen Addition, Division No. 14. This is proposed as a large lot, single-family development. The plat is approximately 10 acres in size and contains 18 lots.

This matter was recently considered by the City Planning Commission at a public hearing and at that time, they recommended approval of the plat, annexation to the City, and initial zoning of RP-A. This Department concurs with that recommendation and it is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for consideration.

At the request of Councilman Groberg, the Director of Planning located the subject area on a map on the wall and further explained the request.

Councilman Groberg then invited anyone who wished to speak concerning this annexation to come forward and be heard at this time.

Mr. Doug Nelson, 2751 Glenwood, appeared to ask the Council to consider provisions in the annexation agreement to provide some safe access to the park area. The park is a wonderful attraction and that attraction can either be a nuisance or a benefit, depending on safe access to and from the park. Sunnyside would not be a safe route for residents to take. He reviewed some possible routes to provide safe access. He said that, in his opinion, it would be a serious mistake to not provide a proper and safe walkway through this development.

Councilman Chandler, asked if the Planning Commission had addressed a walkway to the park in their meeting? Director of Planning Gilchrist answered that it was not, specifically discussed. The developer did present the possibility of providing a walkway down the vacated Hoopes Avenue.

Mr. Daryl Kofoed, Mountain River Engineering and Surveying, appeared and displayed a proposal for a walkway/jogging path for the area that would allow a very nice access from the development to the park. Mr. Dick Skidmore, the developer, appeared to state that he would be willing to work with the City to provide a good, paved five foot

walkway either along abandoned Hoopes Avenue or on Lot 10 of the Addition. During discussion, it was determined that the abandoned Hoopes Avenue property would be a

preferred route, but it was not known whether Custom Land Development, the Hospital and/or both, owned the land which would need to be dedicated for the walkway. It was moved by Councilman Groberg, seconded by Chandler, that the final plat of Rose Nielson Addition, Division #14 be approved and the Mayor, City Clerk and City Engineer be authorized to sign the plat. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilman Deist, Groberg, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; No, none; carried.

Councilman Chandler stated that he feels that there should be an access through the development whether or not the access along abandoned Hoopes Avenue is obtained, and that it be made a matter of record that there may be, at some time, a lighted ballfield in this park.

It was moved by Councilman Groberg, seconded by Chandler, that the annexation agreement be approved, with the conditions that the developer be required to dedicate property for, and construct and pave a five-foot walkway through Lot 10 to the park and that, at the City's request, the developer will convey to the City any portion of the Old Hoopes Road that is owned by the developer. It was moved by Councilman Sakaguchi, seconded by Deist, that the Council approve this contract and authorize the Mayor to sign the necessary document. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Groberg, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; No, none; carried.

The Traffic Safety Committee made the following recommendation: It is recommended that a "NO PARKING AT ANYTIME" Zone be established on the west side of Woodruff Avenue from John Adams Parkway north to Garfield, and to establish a two-way left turn lane on Woodruff from John Adams to Garfield. Councilman Chandler explained the request and located the subject area. It was moved by Councilman Chandler, seconded by Wood, that this recommendation be accepted. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Deist and Groberg; No, none; carried.

Councilman Chandler stated that it has been brought to his attention that there is a traffic problem on Cemetery Drive. It was moved by Councilman Chandler, seconded by Wood, that the Traffic Safety Committee study the traffic pattern on Cemetery Drive and consider one-way traffic, northbound, between 17th and 18th Streets. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Groberg, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, and Deist; No, none; carried.

Councilman Chandler noted that utility poles are being used for illegal posting of campaign, garage sales, and other signs. He asked the Police Department to publicize, discourage and enforce the code covering the unofficial posting of signs within the City.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Groberg, seconded by Chandler, that the meeting adjourn at 8:50 P.M., carried.
