

NOVEMBER 21, 1989

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, met in Special Session in the Council Chamber, 140 So. Capital Avenue on November 21, 1989, at 7:30 P.M. for the purpose of considering all matters which would have been considered on November 23rd, but the date was changed as that was Thanksgiving Day.

Prior to calling the meeting to order, the Mayor called upon Scout Ryan Peck to come forward and lead all in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The Mayor then called the meeting to order and, upon roll call, the following were found to be present: Mayor Thomas Campbell; Councilmen Melvin Erickson, Wesley Deist, Paul Hovey, Sam Sakaguchi, and Art Chandler. Councilman Ralph Wood was absent. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk, Dale Storer, City Attorney and all available Division Directors.

The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of a Special Meeting held at 4:00 P.M., November 9 and recessed until 7:30 P.M. that evening. The minutes were approved.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 5-11-14, CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, RELATING TO THE HOURS OF SALE FOR BEER WITHIN THE CITY; REPEALING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 5-11-14, AND ALLOWING THE SALE OF BEER ON SUNDAY, EXCEPT WITHIN CERTAIN DESIGNATED HOURS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Deist, that this ordinance be passed on its first reading only. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, and Chandler; No, none; carried.

The Mayor stated that he has appointed Jeff Smith and Bill Shelton to fill the expired terms of Chris Bidstrup and Reeves Norman and re-appointed Jay Van Orden to the Electrical Board of Review. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Hovey, that these appointments and re-appointments be confirmed. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, Chandler, and Erickson; No, none; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Hovey, seconded by Erickson, that the meeting adjourn at 7:50 P.M., carried.
