

**OCTOBER 19, 1989**

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The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, October 19, 1989 in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. Prior to calling the meeting to order, the Mayor called upon Silver Girl Scout Jennifer Broman to come forward and lead all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The Mayor then called the meeting to order and, upon roll call, the following were found to be present: Mayor Thomas Campbell; Councilmen Melvin Erickson, Wes Deist, Paul Hovey, Sam Sakaguchi, Ralph Wood, and Art Chandler, Jr. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Joe Burgess, Assistant City Attorney and all available Division Directors.

Coverage is for one year beginning October 29, 1989. The premium has been reduced \$10,928.00 from last year and is \$85,398.00.

**RESOLUTION (Resolution No. 1989-10)**

RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL ADVISORY ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, BONNEVILLE COUNTY, IDAHO, THE QUESTION OF WHETHER THE SALE OF WINE AND BEER BY THE DRINK ON SUNDAY SHOULD BE ALLOWED WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO.

WHEREAS, on October 5, 1989, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, passed a Resolution directing that the question of whether the sale of wine and beer by the drink on Sunday within the City of Idaho Falls be submitted to the qualified electors, at a special advisory election to be held simultaneously with, but separate from, the general election on November 7, 1989.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that the procedures for and manner for conducting such advisory election be determined.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Mayor and Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, hereby resolve:

Section 1. That a special election be held in the City on the same day as the general City election on November 7, 1989, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City the proposition set forth in the form of the ballot appearing in Section 4 hereof. Such special advisory election shall be held simultaneously with, but separate from, the general City election held on such day.

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Section 2. That the polls at the special advisory election shall open at the hour of 12 Noon, and remain open continuously until the hour of 8 P.M., and then close. The special advisory election shall be held at the voting places specified in the form of the Notice of Election set out in Section 7 hereof.

Section 3. That all qualified electors of the City, eighteen (18) years of age or older, who have resided in the City for thirty (30) days prior to the day of the Special advisory election.

Section 4. That the ballots to be used at the special advisory election shall be prepared by the City Clerk, and shall be in substantially the following form:

**QUESTION:** Shall the sale of beer and wine by the drink on Sunday be allowed within the City of Idaho Falls?

**INSTRUCTION TO VOTERS:** To vote on the preceding question, punch the ballot card in the hole to the right of the number next to the word "YES" or "NO" according to the way you desire to vote on the question. All distinguishing marks are forbidden and make the ballot void. Voting for both answers will also make the ballot void. If you, by mistake or accident, mark, tear, deface, or otherwise mutilate this ballot, return it to the election judge and obtain another ballot.

Section 5. For the purposes of this Resolution, the terms "wine" and "beer" shall have the same meanings ascribed in Sections 5-14-1 and 5-11-1, City Code of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Section 6. That the City Clerk shall cause sample ballots to be printed not less than fifteen (15) days before the special advisory election, which example ballots shall be in the same form as the official ballot set forth in Section 4 hereof, except that they shall have printed thereon the words "Sample Ballot", shall be on a paper of a different color than the official ballot and shall not be numbered. The sample ballots shall be available in the office of the City Clerk to be furnished to any person applying therefore to the City Clerk. The City Clerk shall cause the form of sample ballot to be published at least twice in The Post Register, the official newspaper of the City, the last publication to be within five (5) days of the date of the special advisory election.

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Section 7. That notice of the special advisory election shall be given by the City Clerk by publication of a notice of election in The Post Register, the official newspaper of the City, being published and having general circulation in the City, once a week on the same day of two (2) consecutive weeks, the first of which publication shall be not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the special advisory election. The notice of election shall be in substantially the following form:

Pursuant to Resolution of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, Idaho (the "City"), notice is hereby given that a special advisory election will be held in the City on the same day as the general election on Tuesday, November 7, 1989, beginning at the hour of 12 Noon, and closing at the hour of 8 P.M. of said day, for the purpose of taking a vote upon the following question, to-wit:

Only qualified electors of the City, eighteen (18) years of age or older, who have resided in the City for thirty (30) days prior to the day of the special advisory election, and who are registered as provided by law are entitled to vote at the special advisory election. Qualified electors who are fully registered as voters and who vote in at least one (1) general city or county election in the past four (4) years, and who continue to reside at the same address, or within the same precinct in which he or she is registered, shall not be required to register. Any qualified elector who has moved from one precinct to another within the City may vote in that precinct in which he or she is a resident on election day, upon signing, under penalty of perjury, a voter's affidavit at the polls.

Persons may register at the office of the City-County Election Office until and including Friday, October 27, 1989, and with a deputy precinct registrar until and including Friday, October 20, 1989, at any time, during the office hours of the City-County Election Clerk or deputy precinct registrar, as the case may be, except that on the last day of registration with a deputy precinct registrar or at the office of the City-County Election Clerk, persons may register between the hours of 8 A.M. and 8 P.M.

The City Council may take into consideration the answer to the question selected by a plurality of the qualified registered electors voting at the special advisory election, in determining whether or not to allow the sale of wine and beer by the drink on Sunday within the corporate limits of the City of Idaho Falls. This advisory election shall not be deemed as or otherwise construed to be an initiative or referendum election pursuant to the provision of Idaho Code Section 50-501, et seq., or Chapter 15, Title 1, City Code of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho. If the City Council elects to pass an ordinance allowing such sale of wine or beer, this advisory election shall not constrain or prevent the exercise of their full discretion with respect to the passage of such ordinance, nor shall such advisory election mandate the passage thereof.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Mayor and City Council will meet on November 9, 1989 (said date being within six (6) days of the date of the special advisory election) at the hour of 7:30 P.M., at the City Council Chambers, 140 South Capital, in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, for the purpose of canvassing the results of the special advisory election.

Section 8. If the City Council elects to pass an ordinance allowing such sale of wine and beer, nothing herein shall constrain or prevent the exercise of their full discretion with respect to the passage of such ordinance, nor shall anything herein mandate the passage of such ordinance.
