

JUNE 21, 1988

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session, Tuesday, June 21, 1988, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. Prior to calling the meeting to order, the Mayor called upon Micah Maughn to come forward and lead all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The Mayor then called the meeting to order and, upon roll call, the following were found to be present: Mayor Thomas Campbell; Councilmen Wes Deist, Sam Sakaguchi, Ralph Wood, Arthur Chandler, Jr., and Melvin Erickson; Absent: Councilman Paul Hovey. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Joe Burgess, Assistant City Attorney, and all available Division Directors.

The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of the last Regular Council Meeting held June 9, 1988. The minutes were approved by the Mayor and Council.

The Mayor declared open a public hearing, as legally advertised, to consider a request to place a mobile home at 630 Pancheri Drive. He called upon Councilman Wood to conduct the hearing. At the request of Councilman Wood, the City Clerk read this explanatory memo from the City Planner:

Councilman Erickson stated that the Council Safety Committee feels that there has been sufficient input from the citizens since the Council passed the "Day Care" Ordinance on two readings, to warrant the drafting of a new Ordinance. He asked the Attorney to explain the changes in the proposed Ordinance, which included definitions of "Adult", exit windows, window wells, the posting of emergency telephone numbers, freestanding stoves and fireplaces, and the posting of an evacuation plan and address numbers. Councilman Erickson said that the Council Committee feels that these items should be addressed and, therefore, they are recommending that the Ordinance, previously considered, be voided and the Council consider the new Ordinance on its first reading only to allow for further public input. Councilman Erickson invited those who wished to comment to be heard at this time.

Ms. Karen Schaefer, 1255 Mojave, appeared representing the League of Women Voters. She presented the following statement:

Mr. Mayor, Members of the City Council:

I am Karen Shaefer, a Board Member of the Idaho Falls Chapter of the League of Women Voters.

On behalf of the League and other concerned citizens, I would like to express our support of this Ordinance, and to extend our thanks to the Mayor, the Council, the Fire Chief, and the City Attorney for their consideration and cooperation in developing this Ordinance.

Attached are two proposed Agreements with Idaho Fish and Game (IF&G) both of which are related to the Gem State mitigation.

The first Agreement provides for the planting of 12,000 fish annually by IF&G. Under the terms of this Agreement, the City will reimburse the Department for actual costs throughout the term of the FERC license. The 1988 planting cost was \$4,200.00.

The second Agreement provides that the City will purchase approximately 48 acres of off-site mitigation property located near Roberts which was selected by IF&G. In addition, the City agrees to pay the Department, upon title transfer, \$19,000.00 for construction of fences, cattle guards, and other facilities at the site. The City, also, upon title transfer, pays a one time lump sum of \$83,450.00 for IF&G to operate and maintain the site for the term of the license.

Both Agreements have termination provisions and have been approved by IF&G.

The Electric Division recommends Council approval of these agreements.

Mr. Dave Fowler, 1968 Sierra, appeared to ask the Council to reconsider the closing of the road in this area. He said that there will be a lot of people in this area and the dead-end street will create a bottleneck.

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Ms. Karen Schaefer re-appeared to state that she feels the road should remain open so that senior citizens and handicapped people will have better access to the area.

Mr. George Warren, owner/manger of the Driftwood Motel, appeared to state that the closure of the road would be a hardship to his business.

Mr. George W. Watkins, Jr., 2969 21st Street, appeared briefly to register opposition to the closure of River Parkway. He feels it will be a detriment to retail business.

Mr. Dane Watkins, 2242 South Boulevard, appeared to, also, register a request for the Council to leave River Parkway as a through street.

Mr. Bill Mulhall appeared to state that, in his opinion, the advantages of closing the road would be offset by the disadvantages. He feels that leaving the road open will avoid a great deal of problems and still allow people to enjoy the area.

Councilman Deist explained that there has not been a decision made to close River Parkway at this time. He said that studies are being made to obtain cost estimates. He asked the Council to give authorization to advertise for bids on Option I, which would be the entire project from Broadway Bridge to the Driftwood Motel, including sidewalks; Option II would be that portion from the Driftwood Motel to John's Hole Bridge and Option III would be that section from Broadway Bridge to John's Hole Bridge, including sidewalks.

Councilman Deist emphasized the need to begin the project as soon as possible. Several Councilmembers and the Mayor registered concern that the option of leaving River Parkway open had not been included in the design. It was moved by Councilman Deist, seconded by Erickson, that authorization be given for the Parks Department to advertise for bids for the total project and lessor amounts for site improvements. No. 7 recommended that YIELD SIGNS be placed at the southeast corner and the northwest corner of Dickson, yielding to Brentwood be approved. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that this request be approved. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Erickson, and Deist; No, none; carried.

No. 8 recommends that the Traffic Signal at Shoup and D Street be replaced with permanent STOP SIGNS on the southeast and southwest corners of Shoup Avenue in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that the Council approve recommendation No. 8 as presented. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Wood, Chandler, Erickson, Deist, and Sakaguchi; No, none; carried.

The City Attorney presented and reviewed the following captioned ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 1906

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 7-3-8 CITY CODE, IDAHO FALLS, BEING A PORTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 1835, ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO; REGULATING FIREWORKS STANDS; ESTABLISHING A TIME DURING WHICH "SAFE AND SANE" FIREWORKS MAY BE SOLD; PRESERVING PROSECUTION UNDER PRIOR ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY OF SECTIONS AND SUBSECTION OF ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE.

The foregoing ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; no, none; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; no, none; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Chandler, that the meeting adjourn at 8:40 P.M., carried.
