

DECEMBER 22, 1987

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, Idaho met in special public session in the City Council Chambers, at the City Electrical Building, 140 South Capital Avenue, in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, at 7:30 P.M., on December 22, 1987. Prior to calling the meeting to order, Mayor Campbell called upon Scout David Summers to come forward and lead all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The roll was called and the following found to be present: Mayor Thomas Campbell; Councilmen Arthur Chandler, Wesley Deist, Paul Hovey, Ralph Wood, and Melvin Erickson; Absent, Councilman Sam Sakaguchi. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney; Mark Gendron, Engineer, Electric Light Division and all available Division Directors.

The City Clerk presented the evidence of the call of the special meeting.

The City Clerk read a summary of the minutes of the last Regular Council Meeting held December 10th, 1987. The minutes were approved.

Mayor Campbell honored Eagle Scouts Steven Later, Jason Swartzenberger and David Summers. He congratulated these young men for having received this award and wished them well, after which each scout received a congratulatory handshake from all City Officials around the Council Table and a round of applause from all those present in the Council Chamber.

Mayor Campbell then declared open a public hearing to consider the initial zoning of unplatted property adjacent to Hoopes Avenue and asked Councilman Wood, Chairman of the Planning & Zoning Department, to conduct the hearing. At the request of Councilman Wood, the City Clerk read this memo from the City Planner:

Attached is a copy of a legal description of approximately 5 acres of property located adjacent to the east side of Hoopes Avenue and north of 17th Street. In examining records in this office, it appears that this property was inadvertently annexed to the City as a portion of the R & V Park Addition. This action was taken approximately 10 years ago. From examining the records on file, it is uncertain what, if any, zone was placed on this property at the time of annexation. This Department initiated the zoning action of this parcel and recommends an initial zoning of R-3A.

The Planning Commission, at an earlier meeting, unanimously recommended approval of this zoning. This matter is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for approval.

The City Planner further explained the request and located the subject area on a map on the wall. It was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Deist, that the zoning of this area be established as R-3A as requested, that the comprehensive plan be amended to include the area annexed herewith, and that the City Planner be instructed to reflect said annexation, zoning and amendment to the comprehensive plan on the comprehensive plan and zoning

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maps located in his office. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Wood, and Chandler; No, none; carried.

Attorney Mark Fuller appeared stating that he had requested an opportunity to speak to the Mayor and City Council concerning a matter involving one of his clients, Beco, Inc. He said that he had previously provided copies of various documents, to which he would be referring, to all Councilmembers and the City Attorney so that they might have an opportunity to be prepared for his presentation. He said that there are some very specific laws regarding how the City may make purchases or expenditures of City funds, which requires proper competitive bidding and awarding of those bids. He said there is one exception to this provision which allows a municipality to purchase personal property under a state contract which could often save money for the taxpayers. He said that the state had awarded a contract to his client, Beco Corporation, last February and they have purchased all of their asphalt requirements from Beco since that date. He further stated that, during May of 1987, the City of Idaho Falls elected to bid its own contract for the purchase of hot asphalt mix and rejected the low bid of Beco Corporation on the basis that their security was not acceptable, but Beco was not informed of the reason for the rejecting until about two months later. He said that the important point of this issue is that the bid for the state had absolutely no security requirements and yet the City of Idaho Falls rejected the low bid because of "unacceptable security". Fuller said, further, that the City then purchased asphalt from Beco Corporation without any agreement with Beco. He questioned the actions of the City Administrators in this regard, encouraged the City to take a look at what they are doing and threatened a law suit if they continued to operate under such improper practices.

Councilmember Hovey thereupon presented to the City Council the latest draft (December 17, 1987) of the Gem State Project Operating Agreement proposed to be entered into between the City of Idaho Falls and Utah Power & Light Company setting forth the agreement regarding scheduling the delivery of electrical energy to be generated by the Gem State Hydroelectric Project to Utah Power & Light Company and other operational issues, all as contemplated in the January 29, 1985 Gem State Project Power Sales Contract between the City and Utah Power & Light Company.

It was thereupon moved by Councilmember Hovey, seconded by Councilmember Wood, and unanimously adopted, that the draft of the Gem State Project Operating Agreement be entered in the minutes of the meeting. The December 17, 1987 draft of the Gem State Project Operating Agreement was thereupon accepted for filing by the City Clerk.

Thereupon there was a general discussion of the draft of the Operating Agreement related to the Gem State Project Operating Agreement with Utah Power & Light Company, the following resolution was introduced in written form by Councilmember Hovey, was read in full, and pursuant to motion made by Hovey, and seconded by Wood, was adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Councilmen Arthur Chandler, Wesley Deist, Paul Hovey, Ralph Wood, and Melvin Erickson; No, none; carried.

The resolution was thereupon signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk, was ordered recorded and is as follows:

R E S O L U T I O N (Resolution No. 1987-11)

A RESOLUTION authorizing and directing the Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, State of Idaho, to enter into and execute and attest an Operating Agreement between the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho and Utah Power & Light Company in connection with the Gem State Hydroelectric Project.

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho (the "City") is presently constructing the Gem State Hydroelectric Project (the "Project") on the Snake River at river mile 789.76 in Bingham and Bonneville Counties as an

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improvement to the electric generation and distribution system owned and operated by the City, in order to provide for the future electric supply necessary for its citizens and residents:

WHEREAS, pursuant to a Ground Lease, dated January 29, 1985, and a Power Sales Contract, dated January 29, 1985, each between the City and Utah Power & Light Company (the "Company"), providing for the acquisition by the City of leasehold in certain land owned by the Company in the location of and necessary for the construction and operation of the Project and the sale by the City to the Company of a portion of the electric energy to be generated by the Project and not required by the City, it is necessary for the City and the Company to enter into the Gem State Project Operating Agreement, dated as of November 1, 1987 (the "Operating Agreement") setting forth the agreement of the parties regarding the delivery to the Company of electrical energy from the Project, transmission of electrical energy from the Project from the West Side Substation to the delivery point identified in the Operating Agreement, metering, usage of the parties' water rights, and other operational issues;

WHEREAS, the December 17, 1987 draft of the Operating Agreement has been presented to the City Council for review and approval; and

WHEREAS, after consideration of the December 17, 1987 draft of the Operating Agreement it is now desired to authorize and direct the Mayor of the City to enter into and execute, and the City Clerk of the City to attest, the Operating Agreement for and on behalf of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it and it is hereby resolved by the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, State of Idaho, as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor of the City is hereby authorized and directed to enter into and execute, and the City Clerk to attest, the Operating Agreement between the City and the Company in substantially the form as the draft thereof of December 17, 1987, introduced and accepted for filing in the minutes of the meeting at which this resolution is adopted.

Section 2. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed, and this resolution shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its passage and approval.

The Traffic Safety Committee presented three traffic recommendations:

Recommendation #1 was request for no parking on Eastside of Saturn at Vega. Traffic Safety recommends denial of this request. The committee feels that, to eliminate further parking would only move the problem to another intersection on Saturn. Councilman Erickson further explained the recommendation. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that NO PARKING on the east side of Saturn at Vega be denied.
