

**JANUARY 22, 1987**

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The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, January 22, 1987, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. Prior to calling the meeting to order, Mayor Campbell called upon Scout, David Justesen, from Troop #316 to come forward and lead all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The Mayor then called the meeting to order, and upon roll call, the following were found to be present: Mayor Thomas Campbell; Councilmen Art Chandler, Mel Erickson, Wes Deist, Paul Hovey, Sam Sakaguchi, and Ralph Wood. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney and all available Division Directors.

The minutes of the last Regular Council Meeting held January 8th, 1987, were summarized and approved.

The Mayor declared open a public hearing to consider a request for a conditional use permit and called upon Councilman Wood, Chairman of the Planning and Zoning Department, to conduct the hearing. At the request of Councilman Wood, the City Clerk read this explanatory memo from the City Planner:

SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT - STAKER FLORAL

Attached is a copy of a request for a conditional use permit submitted by Lee Staker of Staker Floral. This property is located at the northeast corner of the intersection of Ponderosa and 17th Street in an R-3A zone. Some years ago this business was permitted to be located in an existing residence at this location by a variance granted by the Mayor and Council. The owner later put a small addition on the rear of the building. The owner now wishes to remove that addition and construct a larger (600 sq. ft.) addition to the building to be used as storage and working area.

The Planning Commission, at their regular meeting in December, recommended denial of the request for the following reasons: A section of the Zoning ordinance providing for the issuance of this type of conditional use permit states that there will be no substantial alterations or additions for new construction of any existing building. The Planning Commission also felt that inasmuch as this is a commercial business, the petitioner should seek a commercial zone at this location.

This Department concurs with that recommendation and the matter is now being submitted for your consideration.

Councilman Wood asked the City Attorney to clarify the reasons why the Planning Commission had made their recommendation concerning this request.

Attorney Dale Storer stated that the current City ordinance provides that one of the conditions for a conditional use permit is that the proposed use be confined to existing buildings. It does not permit expansion or remodeling of the building. Therefore, in his

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opinion, this request does not qualify under City ordinance. Councilman Wood stated that, according to City ordinance then, the petitioner has no alternative but to seek a re-zoning of his property to enable him to build.

Councilman Wood then invited the petitioner to speak if he so wished.

Lee Staker, owner of Staker Floral, appeared to state that he has been trying to obtain the required signatures to request a re-zoning, but he has been unable to locate one property owner. He said that he would like to have this remodeling completed by Mother's Day and that he would like the Council to issue a conditional use permit to enable him to begin the work and then start the process for re-zoning. Councilman Wood said that the Council's hands are tied by ordinance and they are unable to allow this request. Therefore, it was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Deist, that the Council deny this request for a conditional use permit. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Chandler, Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, and Wood; No, none; carried.

The Airport Committee recommends that the City implement a fuel flowage fee for all non-contract fuel sales into aircraft at the Airport. All commercial operators including airlines, pay landing fees to support the cost of the maintenance and operation of the Airport. Non-commercial users and transient aircraft operators pay no such user fee.

Therefore, the Committee has directed the City Attorney to prepare an Ordinance to authorize fuel flowage use fees upon non-contract aircraft operators. This fee is comparable to such fees currently assessed by all other commercial service Airports in Idaho.

The Airport Committee recommends that the Ordinance be adopted.

Attorney Storer read the following ordinance caption:

**ORDINANCE NO. 1850**

AN ORDINANCE SETTING FORTH A STATEMENT OF INTENT; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS USED IN THE ORDINANCE; REQUIRING THE PAYMENT OF FUEL

FLOWAGE FEES BY CERTAIN AIRCRAFT USING  
THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS' MUNICIPAL AIRPORT;

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FIXING THE AMOUNT OF THESE FEES AND THE TIME AND MANNER OF COLLECTION THEREOF; ESTABLISHING A FUEL FLOWAGE FEES FUND AND PROVIDING THAT ALL FEES PAID PURSUANT TO THE ORDINANCE BE PLACED IN THIS FUND AND SPECIFYING THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH MONEYS MAY BE DISBURSED THEREFROM; PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE.

The foregoing ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilman Deist, seconded by Chandler, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with, the question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-902 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Erickson, Deist, and Hovey; No, None; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Erickson, Deist, and Hovey; No, none; carried.

A memo from the Traffic Safety Committee was presented and the recommendations considered individually.

Recommendation #1, suggesting the installation of a Stop Sign at the intersection of Mesa and Davidson, stopping traffic on Davidson, was reviewed. Councilman Erickson stated that this intersection has been hazardous in the past and the Traffic Safety Committee feels this will make the intersection safer. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that recommendation #1 be approved. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; No, none; carried.

Recommendation #2, suggesting establishment of three 50' bus parking spaces on the north side of the east end of South Temple Street, was reviewed. Councilman Erickson located the subject area and explained the need. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that this recommendation be approved. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, and Erickson; No, none; carried.

Recommendation #3, suggesting the removal of the NO PARKING signs on the north side of 4th Street from Olive Avenue to the driveway of the Post Office, was considered. This restriction was needed when the NRTS bus lot was located there. There being no question, it was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that this be approved as recommended. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Erickson, and Deist; No, none; carried.

The Traffic Safety Committee then recommended denial of a request for the removal of medians from Holmes just south of Anderson Street, (recommendation #4). Councilman Erickson stated that this request was made by Searle's Husky Service Station operators. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that the request for medians from Holmes, just south of Anderson Street be denied. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Erickson, Deist, and Hovey; No, none; carried.

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Recommendation #5, suggesting denial of a four-way stop sign at St. Clair and Sunnyside was reviewed. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that this request be denied. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Chandler, Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, and Wood; No, none; carried. Councilman Erickson then moved that the Traffic Safety Committee initiate a traffic count at this intersection and record documentation for future review. This motion was seconded by Councilman Wood. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Chandler, Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, and Wood; No, none; carried.

Recommendation #6 which suggested denial of the request for a blinking light on Boulevard on the north and south end of Hawthorne School, was considered. Councilman Erickson said that this request received great consideration as it is in a school zone. He said that the Traffic Safety Committee feels that traffic signalization and a traffic guard already in the area is adequate signalization. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that the Council deny this request. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; No, none; carried.

Recommendation #7 requested denial of an eastbound lane over the railroad tracks from Yellowstone to Eastern Avenue at Ash Street for better access to the Bonneville County Museum. Councilman Erickson stated that the Traffic Safety Committee members feel this request would create a greater traffic hazard at this intersection. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that the Council deny this request. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, and Erickson; No, none; carried.

Item #8, suggesting denial of the request for a pedestrian crossing on North Temple, was read. Denied on the basis of this being a mid-block cross-walk. Councilman Erickson said that, now the hospital has moved from this area, there is a change in the property use. He said the Committee feels a crosswalk in this area would give the pedestrian a sense of false security and create a traffic hazard. Erickson added that, if the use of this property is later changed to necessitate the response of public safety units, the Council may need to take further action. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that the request for a pedestrian crossing on North Temple be denied. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Erickson, and Deist; No, none; carried.

Recommendation #9 suggested the denial of the request for a crosswalk on North Boulevard at Del Monte Corporation. Denied on basis of this being mid-block crosswalk. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that this request be denied. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Wood, Chandler, Erickson, Deist, Hovey, and Sakaguchi; No, none; carried.

Recommendation #10 suggested denial of a request from Rogers Food for access onto Pancheri Drive. The Traffic Safety Committee felt there could be no access onto Pancheri without creating a traffic hazard. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that this item be recessed until the February 5th Council Meeting to allow time for the requesters to formally present a lay-out as to where they want the access. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Chandler, Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, and Wood; No, none; carried.

Recommendation #11, was considered, suggesting denial of a request for signalization (traffic-pedestrian) at the intersection of Grandview and Saturn. Counts remain static and there are no walkways on either side of Grandview. Also, this intersection does not meet warrant. Councilman Hovey stated that, to his knowledge, the State previously had informed the City that they could not allow a signal of any kind on Grandview and Saturn under any conditions, as it would cause traffic back-up over John's Hole Bridge

and eliminate access onto the freeway. Other Councilmembers agreed that this was correct. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that this request be denied. Roll

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call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, and Chandler; No, none; carried.

It was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Erickson, that these appointments be confirmed by the Council.
