

SEPTEMBER 18, 1986

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Meeting, Thursday, September 18, 1986, in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: Mayor Thomas Campbell; Councilmen Arthur Chandler, Wesley Deist, Melvin Erickson, Paul Hovey, Sam Sakaguchi, and Ralph Wood. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney, and all available Division Directors.

A summary of the minutes of the last Regular Council Meeting held September 4th, 1986, was read and the minutes approved by the unanimous vote of the Council.

Mayor Campbell then asked Councilman Wood to conduct annexation proceedings for Shamrock Park Addition, Division #5. Councilman Wood asked the City Clerk to read the following memo from the City Planner:

The foregoing ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Deist, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with, the question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-902 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, and Erickson; No, none; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Erickson, Chandler, Wood, Sakaguchi, Hovey, and Deist; No, none; carried.

Mayor Campbell then declared open a public hearing to consider the initial zoning of the newly annexed area and called upon Councilman Wood to conduct this hearing. Councilman Wood invited any one present who wished to speak concerning this zoning to be heard at this time. There being no one to appear and no questions nor comment, it was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Deist, that the initial zoning of Shamrock Park Addition, Division No. 5 be established as R-1, and that the Comprehensive Plan be amended to include the area annexed herewith, and that the City Planner be instructed to reflect said annexation, zoning, and amendment to the Comprehensive Plan on the Comprehensive Plan and zoning maps located in his office. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, Erickson, and Deist; No, none; carried.

The following petition, with approximately 620 signatures, was presented:

WHEREAS, the area near and served by the intersection of SUNNYSIDE ROAD and SOUTH YELLOWSTONE HIGHWAY has experienced industrial and residential growth resulting in greatly increased "four direction" traffic flow, and whereas said intersection is now inadequately protected to provide safe use. We, the undersigned citizens of Idaho Falls and/or Bonneville County do hereby petition the City of Idaho Falls to install adequate traffic control devices at said intersection.

Mayor Campbell gave a report on what the City has done concerning this request. He said that the State is responsible for this intersection and the City cannot install traffic signals there as it is out of the City's jurisdiction to do so. He said that the City Administrators have been asking the State to signalize this intersection for several years, but their reply has always been that it is a scheduled project for 1989, it requires the widening of the highway and there will be no action until the project reaches the top of the "priority" list and the road is widened. He said, further, that members of the Highway Board were in the City last week and he asked the Administrator Keith Green and his board members to review the intersection. The Mayor said that he and Public Works Director Stanger had visited with LeRoy Meyer, District Manager of the State Highway Department, and he said that the Highway Department has changed direction slightly and they are now saying that they will install a temporary traffic signal at this location in 1987 and, possibly some roadwork. The Mayor said that this is a complicated project as many other facets and entities are involved. The Mayor ordered the City Clerk to file the petition and stated that he and the Public Works Director will continue to work with the State Highway Department for a solution to this

problem. He said that he will call the person who presented the petition to him and inform him of the Council's stand on this issue.

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Mayor Campbell then honored City Treasurer Lorna Coughlin who recently became the recipient of the esteemed Marvin Kimberling award from the City Clerk's and Finance Officers Association.

4. Suggest designation of Hartert Drive between Holmes and Sunnyside as 25 MPH speed.
5. Install a crosswalk on Holmes Avenue on the North side of Hartert with advanced warning signs and a varicom on Holmes changing the speed from 35 MPH to 20 MPH during the time of school children crossing Holmes.

Recommendation #1 was received. Councilman Erickson explained the need for these recommendations. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Wood, that the Council approve this request. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, Wood, Chandler, and Erickson; No, none; carried.
