

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session in the Mayor's conference room at City Hall, on the 16th day of October, 1985, at 12:00 Noon, for the purpose of selecting three sites for a proposed swimming pool so that they may be placed on the ballot for the election November 5, 1985.

There were present at said meeting: Mayor Thomas Campbell; Councilmen Wes Deist, Mel Erickson, Paul Hovey, and Sam Sakaguchi. Absent: Councilmen Art Chandler and Ralph Wood. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney.

Attorney Storer presented the following Resolution:

R E S O L U T I O N (Resolution No. 1985-07)

RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL ADVISORY ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, BONNEVILLE COUNTY, IDAHO, THE QUESTION OF WHERE AN INDOOR SWIMMING POOL AND RELATED FACILITIES SHOULD BE LOCATED, IN THE EVENT THE CITY IS AUTHORIZED TO AND DECIDES TO CONSTRUCT SAID SWIMMING POOL AND FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, on October 1, 1985, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho passed Ordinance No. 1805, calling for a special bond election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, Idaho, the question of whether \$1,650,000 General Obligation Public Recreation Facilities Bonds of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, should be issued for the purpose of providing sufficient funds to construct an indoor swimming pool, dressing rooms, instructional facilities and associated parking facilities;

WHEREAS, in the event the proposition to be submitted to the qualified electors at said special bond election is passed by a two-thirds majority vote of these qualified electors voting thereat, the City Council has the authority to designate a location for such public recreation facilities;

WHEREAS, in determining the location of said swimming pool and recreation facilities the City Council desires to take into consideration the desires of the qualified electors of the City with respect to the location of said swimming pool and recreational facilities:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Mayor and Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, hereby resolve:

Section 1. That a special advisory election is hereby called to be held in the City on the same day as the general City election on November 5, 1985, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City the proposition set forth in the form of the ballot appearing in Section 4 hereof.

Section 2. That the polls at the special advisory election shall open at the hour of 12 o'clock Noon and remain open continuously until the hour of 8 o'clock P. M. and then close. The special advisory election shall be held at the voting places specified in the form of notice of election set out in Section 6 hereof.

Section 3. That all qualified electors of the City, eighteen (18) years of age or older, who have resided in the City for thirty (30) days prior to the day of the special advisory election and who are registered as provided by law are entitled to vote at the special advisory election.

Section 4. That the ballots to be used at the special advisory election shall be prepared by the City Clerk, and shall be in substantially the following form:

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS: To vote on the preceding question, punch the ballot card in the hole next to the right of the site where you desire to have the swimming pool and recreational facilities constructed. All marks are forbidden. All distinguishing marks are forbidden and make the ballot void. Do not vote for more than one site and do not indicate an order of preference by numbers or any other means. To do so will make the ballot void. If you, by mistake or accident, mark, tear, deface, or otherwise mutilate this ballot, return it to the election judges and obtain another ballot.

Section 5. For the purposes of this Resolution, the following terms shall have the meaning set forth herein: (i) "Central School Site" shall mean the property generally located between 6th and 7th Streets and bounded by South Boulevard on the west and South Lee Avenue on the east within the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho; (ii) "Freeman Park Site" shall mean the certain property located within Freeman Park immediately north of Presto Avenue within the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho; (iii) "Skyline Site" shall mean that certain property generally located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Pancheri Drive and Grizzly Avenue within the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Section 6. That the City Clerk shall cause sample ballots to be printed not less than fifteen (15) days before the special advisory election, which sample ballots shall be in the same form as the official ballot set forth in Section 4 hereof, except that they shall have printed thereon the words "Sample Ballot", shall be on paper of a different color than the official ballot and shall not be numbered. The sample ballots shall be available in the office of the City Clerk to be furnished to any person applying therefor to the City Clerk. The City Clerk shall cause the form of sample ballot to be published at least twice in The Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City, the last publication to be within five days of the date of the special advisory election.

Section 7. That notice of the special advisory election shall be given by the City Clerk by publication of notice of election in The Post Register, the official newspaper of the City, being published and having general circulation in the City, once a week on the same day of two (2) consecutive weeks, the first of which publication shall be not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date fixed for the holding of the special advisory election. The notice of election shall be in substantially the following form:

Pursuant to Resolution of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, Idaho (the "City"), notice is hereby given that a special advisory election will be held in the City on the same day as the general City election on Tuesday, November 5, 1985, beginning at the hour of 12 o'clock Noon and closing at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M. of said day, for the purpose of taking a vote upon the following question, to-wit:

Notice is further given that only qualified electors of the City, eighteen (18) years of age or older, who have resided in the City for thirty (30) days prior to the day of the special advisory election, and who are registered as provided by law are entitled to vote at the special advisory election. No qualified elector who is duly registered as a voter and who voted in at least one (1) general city or county election in the past four (4) years, and who continued to reside at the same address, or within the same precinct in which he is registered, shall be required to re-register. But any elector (i) who has failed or neglected heretofore to vote in at least one (1) general city or county election in the past four (4) years, (ii) who has not registered, (iii) who has had his

registration canceled by the proper election official as provided by law, or (iv) who has changed his residence (excluding a change within a precinct not requiring re-registration) must re-register.

An elector may register at the City-County Election Office at the Bonneville County Courthouse, 605 North Capital Avenue, in the City, or before the deputy precinct registrars appointed and named as follows:

Persons may register at the office of the City-County Election Office until and including Friday, October 25, 1985, and with a deputy precinct registrar until and including Friday, October 18, 1985, at any time during the office hours of the City-County Election Clerk or deputy precinct registrar, as the case may be, except that on Friday, October 25, 1985, (with respect to registration at the City-County Election Office) and on Friday, October 18, 1985 (with respect to deputy precinct registrars) persons may register in any of said offices between the hours of 8 o'clock A.M. and 8 o'clock P.M.

Any registered elector of the City may make written application to the City-County Election Office in accordance with law for an absentee ballot, provided that an absentee ballot must be received by the counting room election staff by 8 o'clock P.M. on the day of the special advisory election in order to be counted.

The voting at the special advisory election shall be by separate ballot. The ballots to be supplied the voters for their use at the special advisory election shall be in the form set forth in the Resolution of the City Council dated October 16, 1985.

The City Council may take into consideration the site selected by a plurality of the qualified registered electors voting at the special advisory election, in determining the location of the indoor swimming pool and related recreational facilities.

The sites under consideration are: 1) the Central School site consisting of property located between 6th and 7th Streets and bounded by South Boulevard on the west and South Lee on the east; 2) the Freeman Park site consisting of property located within Freeman Park immediately north of Presto Avenue; 3) the Skyline site consisting of the property located at the southeast corner of the intersection of Pancheri Drive and Grizzly Avenue.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT THE Mayor and City Council will hold a special meeting on November 7, 1985 (said date being within six (6) days of the date of the special advisory election), at the hour of 12 o'clock Noon at the City-County Election Office, 605 N. Capital, in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, for the purpose of canvassing the results of the special advisory election.

Section 8. In the event the proposition submitted at the special bond election pursuant to Ordinance No. 1805 is passed by a two-thirds majority vote of the qualified registered electors voting at said election, the City Council may, in determining the location of the swimming pool and related facilities, take into consideration the preferred site for said facilities as determined by a plurality of those qualified registered electors voting at said special advisory election.

Section 9. That the following suitable polling places and respective deputy precinct registrars are hereby designated for the following precincts for, and the following persons are hereby appointed to act as judges and as clerks of, the special advisory election:

The City Clerk is hereby directed to provide for voting by absentee ballot in the manner set forth in Idaho Code Section 50-442 through 50-451.

Section 10. That the Mayor and City Council shall hold a special public meeting on November 7, 1985, a date within six (6) days following the special advisory election, at the hour of 12 o'clock Noon at the City-County Election Office, 605 N. Capital, in the City for the purpose of canvassing the results of the special advisory election and thereupon the result shall be entered in the minutes of the City Clerk and proclaimed as final.

Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Deist, Hovey, Sakaguchi, and Erickson; No, none; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Deist, seconded by Erickson, that the meeting adjourn at 12:30 P.M., carried.
