

JULY 19, 1984

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The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Council Meeting, Thursday, July 19th, 1984, in the Council Chambers in Idaho Falls, Idaho. Prior to calling the meeting to order, Mayor Campbell called upon Scout Chris Hunter to come forward and lead all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. The Mayor then called the meeting to order and, upon roll call, the following were found to be present: Mayor Tom Campbell; Councilmen Mel Erickson, Wes Deist, Paul Hovey, Sam Sakaguchi, and Ralph Wood. Absent, Councilman Art Chandler. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Arthur Smith, acting City Attorney, Steve Harrison, Electrical Engineer, and all other available Division Directors. Mayor Campbell excused Councilman Chandler as he was in Salt Lake City with his daughter Libbie who was critically ill.

Minutes of the last Regular Council meeting held July 5th, and a special meeting held July 10, 1984, were summarized and approved by the unanimous vote of the Council.

Mayor Campbell introduced Joe Barrows from Kirchner-Moore Company, who is acting consultant on financing for the Gem State Project, and thanked him for his presence.

Mayor Campbell then presented inscribed gold watches to city employee retirees Terry Gardner and George Morrall and gave a resume' of their years of employment with the City. Each of these gentlemen then received a congratulatory handshake from all City officials around the Council table and a round of applause from all those present in the Council Chamber.

Mayor Campbell then declared open a public hearing to consider the amendment of the 1983-1984 fiscal year budget, and called upon Councilman Hovey to conduct the hearing. Hovey explained the need for this amendment.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 4-11-2 OF THE CITY CODE OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO AND SECTION 4 ORDINANCE NO. 1705, ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, ADOPTING CERTAIN AMENDMENTS TO THE UNIFORM BUILDING CODE RELATING TO ACCESSORY BUILDINGS, PERMIT FEES, CERTIFICATES OF OCCUPANCY, FIREWALLS, STAIRS, EXITS, HEADROOM, FOR STAIRWAY CLEARANCE AND SNOW-PROOF ENCLOSURES; DECLARING THAT A PORTION OF THE APPENDIX TO THE UNIFORM BUILDING CODE IS NOT ADOPTED; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND FOR A SAVING CLAUSE; FIXING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING WHEN THE ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.
