

JULY 22, 1982

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Meeting, Thursday, July 22, 1982 in the Council Chamber in Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Prior to calling the meeting to order, the Mayor asked Cub Scout Cody Stanger to come forward to the Council Table and lead all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The Mayor then called the meeting to order, and upon roll call, the following were found to be present: Mayor Tom Campbell; Councilmen Sam Sakaguchi, Art Chandler, Mel Erickson, and Wes Deist. Absent: Councilmen Ralph Wood and Paul Hovey. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, City Attorney; and all other available Division Directors.

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting held on July 8, 1982 and a Special Meeting held on July 13, 1982 were read and approved.

Mayor Campbell honored Eagle Scouts Mike Nielson and Michael Eagle. The Mayor congratulated these fine young men for their accomplishments and presented each with a Certificate of Appreciation, after which each young man received a congratulatory handshake from all City Officials around the Council Table.

KQPI News Reporter Bill Powell presented the following proclamation:

Honorable Mayor, Gentlemen of the Council, Madame Clerk: It is well recognized that our Mayor is preeminent in the art of issuing proclamations...but it should also be recognized that each citizen of this fair City has a right to promulgate proclamations and...if given the chance pronounce them...so this evening...

A PROCLAMATION

Please recall that this office represents Messrs. Norbert Kleiber and Burkhardt Kleiber, proprietors of the hot dog vending cart which was licensed by your office, but whose license was revoked by action of the City Council. The Kleibers believe their license to have been revoked without just cause, in contravention of law and in violation of due process, by reason of which they intend to initiate suit absent a willingness by the City to compensate them for their losses to date, and to reinstate their license.

Attached is a copy of an Engineering Change Order related to the IECO Agreement.

This change request is primarily due to addition construction management time and costs required to complete the project. The original schedule called for project completion about July, but now a mid-September completion date is more realistic.

This contract is a "cost, plus fixed fee" arrangement whereby no fee is paid on this addition increase.

Approval of this Change Order will increase project engineering costs by \$440,492.00. No additional engineering expenditures are expected through project completion.
