

FEBRUARY 5, 1981

Prior to calling the meeting to order, the Mayor called upon Carmen Perez from Girl Scout Troop No. 597 to come forward and lead all those present in the Pledging of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Mayor then called the meeting to order, and upon roll call, the following were found to be present: Mayor Tom Campbell; Councilmen Wes Deist, Paul Hovey, Sam Sakaguchi, Ralph Wood, Art Chandler, and Mel Erickson. Also present: Velma Chandler, City Clerk; Dale Storer, Assistant City Attorney; and, all other available Division Directors.

Minutes of the last Regular Council Meeting held January 22, 1981 were read and approved.

Councilman Erickson stated that Detective Captain Ralph Hutchens and Detective Sergeant Dick Ackerman had recently retired from the Police Force. Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 9, Title 6, Idaho Code, entitled "Tort Claims Against Governmental Entities", notice is given of an accident occurring December 5, 1980, at 11:00 o'clock p.m. on Lincoln Road in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, when a vehicle driven by me was involved in an accident as a result of a narrow bridge. Russell T. Coffee was killed in the accident. My vehicle was damaged to an estimated \$2,000.00.

I am a resident of Firth, Idaho, and have been so for a period of six months prior to the time the claim arose.

It is anticipated the damages will involve estimated \$1,900.00 medical bills, some \$2,000.00 collision vehicle damage, an estimated \$2,000.00 funeral expense, as well as general damages.

The reason for this letter is to comply with the indicated statute to give you notice of the occurrence of the accident and to advise of a potential claim both on my behalf for vehicle damage and medical expense and my intention to seek reimbursement and contribution for damages in the event any claim is made against me on behalf of Russell T. Coffee. It is estimated that damages could be substantial, the amount cannot be ascertained at this time.

SUBJECT: DETERMINATION OF PERMITTED USES IN COMMERCIAL ZONES

It has recently come to the attention of this office that indoor amusement enterprises are not properly addressed in the Zoning Ordinance. Bowling alleys, pool and billiard rooms are permitted in the RSC-1 zone, but other similar uses are not mentioned in commercial zones. As examples, tennis courts or handball courts are not mentioned.

The Planning Commission recently reviewed this matter at a work session, and at that time, it was felt all indoor amusement enterprises should be permitted in commercial zones. This Department concurs with the opinion expressed by the Planning Commission.

This matter is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for a determination under the clause in the Zoning Ordinance which states that similar uses may be permitted in a zone, if the Council rules such use is in harmony with the intent of the zone.

SUBJECT: TRAFFIC RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Suggest removal of the 25 MPH signs on Lindsay Boulevard between Broadway and the Grandview Exchange. This would allow a speed of 35 MPH which we suggest after radar speed checks by both the City and County.

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2. Suggest a speed of 25 MPH on 25th Street between Leslie and Rollandet Avenues. Also, the repainting of the crosswalk on 25th Street between the buildings of the Child Development Center with appropriate signs installed. (Present speed is 35 MPH and there was a crosswalk which was covered when the street was chipped. There are about sixty (60) students ranging from twelve years old to adults crossing at least twice daily.)

Recommendation No. 1, suggesting removal of the 25 MPH signs on Lindsay Boulevard, between Broadway and the Grandview Exchange to allow a speed of 35 MPH was considered. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Deist, that the 25 MPH signs be removed, allowing 35 MPH as recommended. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, None; carried.

Recommendation No. 2, suggesting a speed of 25 MPH on 25th Street between Leslie and Rollandet Avenues and the repainting of the crosswalk on 25th Street between the buildings of the Child Development Center and appropriate signs, were considered. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Deist, that this recommendation be approved as requested. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, none; carried.

Assistant City Attorney Storer presented this Ordinance covering cross-connections and contamination of the City Water Supply System. It was explained that this Ordinance had been passed on its first reading only at the last Regular Council Meeting. Attorney Storer reviewed the caption of the Ordinance as follows:

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, RELATING TO THE CONTROL AND ELIMINATION OF CROSS-CONNECTIONS AND CONTAMINATION OF THE CITY WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM. SETTING FORTH THE PURPOSE, DEFINING TERMS, DECLARING IT UNLAWFUL TO POLLUTE OR CONTAMINATE THE CITY WATER SUPPLY OR TO INSTALL OR MAINTAIN ANY CROSS-CONNECTION WITHIN THE CITY; REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION OF BACKFLOW PREVENTION DEVICES AND REGULATING THE INSTALLATION THEREOF, REQUIRING ALL BACKFLOW PREVENTION DEVICES TO BE INSPECTED AND TESTED AT INSTALLATION AND ANNUALLY THEREAFTER; REQUIRING PERMITS FOR INSTALLATION OF BACKFLOW PREVENTION DEVICES AND DECLARING IT UNLAWFUL TO INSTALL, RELOCATE, OR REMOVE A BACKFLOW PREVENTION DEVICE WITHOUT A PERMIT; PROHIBITING THE CONNECTION TO THE CITY WATER SUPPLY OF ANY NEW BUILDING, IMPROVEMENT OR STRUCTURE WITHOUT INSPECTION BY THE CITY WATER SUPERINTENDENT; PROVIDING FOR INSPECTIONS

BY THE CITY OF EXISTING BUILDINGS,
STRUCTURES OR IMPROVEMENTS AND
REQUIRING TERMINATION OF THE WATER SUPPLY

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TO PREMISES HAVING CROSS-CONNECTIONS OR FOR WHICH A BACKFLOW PREVENTION DEVICE IS REQUIRED; REPEALING PRIOR INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES; PROVIDING THAT PROVISIONS OF THE ORDINANCE ARE SEPARABLE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The foregoing ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilman Sakaguchi, seconded by Deist, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with, the question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-902 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, None; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, none; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Chandler, seconded by Erickson, that the meeting adjourn at 8:05 p.m.; carried.
