

**DECEMBER 5, 1978**

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session in the Bonneville Hotel on Tuesday, December 5<sup>th</sup>, 1978, at 12:00 o'clock noon for the purpose of determining whether or not the City will accept the INTERSEC Building. There were present at said meeting: Mayor Tom Campbell; Councilmen Paul Hovey, Charles Clark, Jim Freeman, Mel Erickson, and Sam Sakaguchi. Absent: Councilman Wood. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Arthur Smith, City Attorney; Chad Stanger, General Services Director.

Noting the purpose of the meeting, the Mayor asked for comment from Councilman Erickson, Chairman of the General Services Committee. Erickson invited City Attorney Smith to present and read aloud the following:

The Board of Directors of the Intermountain Science Experience Center (INTERSEC) voted today to voluntarily turn the Center back to the City as per original agreement and lease with the City of Idaho Falls.

Since it is our understanding the Eastern Idaho Vocational-Technical School proposes to use the building as per its original intent and to preserve, at least a portion of the original hands-on type cultural experience integrity of the Center, we recommend you considering their proposal.

It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Sakaguchi, that the Golf Course Committee, working with the City Attorney, be authorized to pursue new applicants for lessees for this restaurant and that the City Council go on record as expressing appreciation to the Stoffels for their efficient operation of the restaurant during their tenure as leases. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none, carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Freeman, that the meeting adjourn at 12:30 P.M., carried.
