

**OCTOBER 20, 1977**

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The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Meeting, Thursday, October 20<sup>th</sup>, 1977, at 7:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor S. Eddie Pedersen; Councilman Jim Freeman, Mel Erickson, Gil Karst and Paul Hovey; Absent: Councilmen Ralph Wood and Tom Campbell. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Arthur Smith, City Attorney; and, all other available Division Directors.

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting, held October 6<sup>th</sup> and a Special Meeting held October 11<sup>th</sup>, 1977, were read and approved.

The Mayor acknowledged the Methodist Church sponsored Boy Scout Troop 6 in the Council Chambers. The Mayor thanked these young men for their presence and their interest in local government.

Recognizing from the Agenda that the Council was to consider annexation of the Alice Dickson Estates, Division No. 4, the Mayor asked that this introductory memo from the Building Administrator be read aloud:

**ORDINANCE NO. 1522**

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO; DESCRIBING SAID LANDS AND DECLARING SAME A PART OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO. (Alice Dickson Estates Addition, Division No. 4)

The foregoing ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Hovey, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with, the

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question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-902 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

The foregoing area having been annexed, the Mayor announced that this was the time were none who appeared in protest or otherwise comment on said zoning as recommended by the Planning Commission. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Hovey, that the Alice Dickson Estates, Division No. 4 be initially zoned RP-A and the Building Official be directed to reflect said zoning on the official zoning map, located in his office. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

The Mayor invited Don Lloyd, Public Works Director, to escort the following City employees to the Council table: Messrs. Bill Bubbock, Monte Clark and Don Holverson from the Sewer Department and Gordon Steel from the Water Department. The Mayor noted that, in each instance, these men had voluntarily taken of their time to attend certain courses sponsored by the University of Idaho, the Idaho State Department of Health and other agencies and that, having successfully completed said course, were entitled to operator's certificates, as follows:

Don Holverson	- Class III Sewage Treatment Plant
Gordon Steel	- Class III Water Dept. Plant

The Mayor commended these men for their dedication in this regard and, in each instance, the important function that they played in two very essential utility operations. They then received certificates as heretofore described and a congratulatory handshake from all City Officials around the Council Table.

The City Clerk presented a Liquor Catering permit in favor of Harry Yee to sell liquor by the drink on October 13<sup>th</sup> at the Monte Wight open house at 468 Anderson Street. It was explained that, in the interests of time, this permit was issued with the approval of the Police Chief but without formal approval from the Council. Asked for comment, City Attorney Smith explained that Council authorization was necessary for him, as City Attorney, to represent a City employee where legal action was involved. Smith said that, in his opinion, this would be justifiable, inasmuch as Officer Forrest was on active duty at the time of the incident which prompted the claim in question. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Karst, that the City Attorney be authorized to represent Officer Forrest as recommended. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

From the Traffic Safety Committee came this memo:

SUBJECT: TRAFFIC RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Lava Street was designated as a TRUCK ROUTE several years ago and ONE WAY WESTBOUND to alleviate the traffic on Broadway and due to NO LEFT TURN on Yellowstone at Cliff. It has served well in the past but in no longer needed with development of Pancheri and Utah Avenue.

The Stated of Idaho Transportation Department is in accord with our recommendation that Lava Street revert back to a two-way residential street by removal of the signs.

2. Recommend eliminating LEFT turns for southbound traffic on Holmes Avenue at Lomax Street along with eliminating the left turn for northbound traffic on Holmes at First Street.
3. Suggested Traffic Signals be installed at Pancheri and Skyline. Count of vehicles indicate warrant for same.
4. Suggest Traffic Signals be installed at 17<sup>th</sup> and Woodruff. Count of vehicles indicate warrant for same.
5. Paint crosswalks at following locations around Edgemont School.
  1. Across 21<sup>st</sup> and eastside of Arctic.
  2. Across 21<sup>st</sup> and eastside of Sequoia.
  3. Across Santalema north of 21<sup>st</sup> Street.
  4. Across Sequoia north of 21<sup>st</sup> Street.
  5. Across Sequoia on south side of Azalea.
  6. Across Azalea on west side of Jeppson.

6. Recommend a STOP sign be installed on Balboa at Monticello northbound.

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7. Recommend 25 MPH zone on Santalema.

It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Karst, that the truck route designation on Lava Street be removed for the reason as stated and that for a reasonable time, two way traffic signs be installed. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

Recommendation No. 2 was then reviewed. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Hovey, that elimination of left turns for south bound traffic on Holmes at Lomax Street and, also, for northbound traffic on Holmes at First Street be approved. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

With reference to the intersection at Lomax and Holmes, Councilman Freeman suggested that, in the interests of easier access, all curbs be rounded, even recognizing that on the northwest corner, it might be necessary to remove a pole. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Hovey, that this be referred to the Traffic Safety Committee for study and recommendation. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

With reference to recommendation No. 3, it was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Karst, that installation of traffic signals at Pancheri and Skyline be referred to the Electric Light and Public Works Division for implementation and also, an establishment of cost be made and reflected back to the Council for study and consideration. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

Recommendation No. 4 was then reviewed. Councilman Erickson drew attention to previous Council deliberation on this intersection at which time it was decided that 17<sup>th</sup> and St. Clair would take priority and that a traffic light at 17<sup>th</sup> and Woodruff could be postponed until Woodruff was extended south of 17<sup>th</sup>. However, continued Erickson, it is now recognized that said extension may take years and meanwhile, particularly because of a nearby shopping center, traffic control is needed. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Hovey, that installation of traffic signals at 17<sup>th</sup> Street and Woodruff be referred to the Electric Light and Public Works Divisions for implementation and, also, an establishment of cost be made and reflected back to the Council for study and consideration. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

Councilman Erickson reminded the Council that Mrs. Speake, representing the Jennie Lee residents, had, some time back, proposed cross walks around the Edgemont School area and said proposal prompted Recommendation No. 5. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Hovey, that these crosswalks, at the locations as described, be approved. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

Also, continued Erickson, Recommendations No. 6 and 7, being in a related area, were prompted by a recommendation by Mrs. Speake. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Karst, that a STOP sign be installed on Balboa at Monticello, north bound. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Hovey, that 25 MPH speed zone be approved on Santalema. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

Councilman Hovey asked the opinion of the Council as to the advisability of some better traffic control at John Adams and Woodruff. It was generally agreed that this could well be a traffic recommendation for consideration by the Traffic Safety Committee after near-by shopping center is completed.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 6-3-6, CITY  
CODE OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO; DECLARING  
DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE IN THE IDAHO FALLS

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AREA TO BE PUBLIC NUISANCES AND AUTHORIZING THE IMPOUNDMENT OF SUCH DOGS; SETTING FORTH THE TERMS OF IMPOUNDMENT, REDEMPTION, SALE OR REQUIRING THAT ANY UNREDEEMED DOG SHALL BE NEUTERED OR SPAYED BEFORE BEING SOLD BY THE POUND MASTER; PROVIDING WHEN THE ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.

Councilman Erickson introduced Mrs. Don Suckling and Marilyn Hall, both present in the Council Chamber. Erickson noted that these ladies had devoted much time and effort toward bettering the activities and functions of the animal shelter. Asked for comment, Mrs. Suckling appeared briefly to say that an arrangement had been made with local veterinarians for neutering dogs at a reduced fee. She said her group was satisfied with this proposed ordinance as drafted except that, in her opinion, similar neutering regulations should apply to cats. Erickson recognized this as a problem which would likely be considered at a later date. The foregoing ordinance, then, was presented to the Council for consideration. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Karst, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-902 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

In the form of a report to the Council, Erickson said the subject of Day Care Center licensing was being studied and a recommendation would soon be forthcoming.

Councilman Erickson then referred to a recent request that truck traffic on 17<sup>th</sup> Street between Boulevard and Yellowstone be eliminated. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Freeman, that this be referred to the Traffic Safety Committee for study and recommendation. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

Police Chief Pollock appeared before the Council to advise that there are 70 security alarms within the City and, at the time the Police Department moved into its new quarters at the City-County law enforcement facility, an agreement with a qualified security system company will be necessary for purposes of re-locating the control cabinet plus provision for service from said cabinet to the communication center. Pollock continued by saying that the Fidelity Security System Company is presently responsible for 50 to 70 alarms now in operation and recommended that said company be delegated for the assignment. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, seconded by Karst, that the City Attorney be directed to prepare an appropriate agreement between the City and Fidelity Security Systems and that said agreement be then presented to the Council for consideration. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, none; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Freeman, seconded by Erickson, that the meeting adjourn at 9:05 P.M., carried.
