

DECEMBER 8, 1977

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Meeting, Thursday, December 8, 1977, at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present at said meeting: Mayor S. Eddie Pedersen; Councilmen Tom Campbell, Jim Freeman, Mel Erickson, Ralph Wood, and Paul Hovey. Absent: Councilman Gil Karst. Also present: Velma Chandler, Deputy City Clerk; Arthur Smith, City Attorney; and all other available Division Directors.

Minutes of the last recessed Regular Meeting held November 29, 1977, were read and approved.

The Mayor announced that this was the time and the place, as advertised, for a public hearing to consider a variance request as introduced by this memo from the Building Administrator:

SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR VARIANCE

Attached is a copy of a request for a use variance requesting to utilize lots now zoned R-2 for automobile parking. This proposed parking would be located on Lot 7, Block 1, Linden Park Addition, Division No. 1, and lies adjacent to the south side of Russet Street. The request is submitted by Carl Campbell of Wenatchee, Washington, the builder of a retirement center to be located on the adjacent property which is now zoned R-3A.

The frontage on Russet for the entire length of the block between Linden Drive and Lincoln Drive is now zoned R-2 and the petitioner does not want to change the zoning and has, therefore, submitted the request for a variance. This would provide 10 additional parking spaces, which are needed to meet the parking requirements. The petitioner proposes to landscape the subject property, and screen it from Russet Street.

This office has no objection to the proposal. This request is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for your consideration.

Councilman Campbell explained that the area was designed for apartments for senior citizens who were still able to care for themselves. He explained, further, that a variance was necessary to allow for parking in an R-2 zone. There were none who appeared to protest or otherwise comment on this variance application. It was moved by Councilman Campbell, seconded by Erickson, that this request for a variance, as described, be granted. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none; carried.

Mr. Nolan Young, 560 11th Street, appeared before the Council. Mr. Young registered concern, as an interested taxpayer, that the City was in the process of entering into an agreement with the Salvation Army whereby that agency would occupy the old library building. Mr. Young emphasized the fact that he had nothing but the highest respect for the Salvation Army and the services that agency rendered the community. He questioned only the constitutionality of the tax payer's dollar being used for its support.

Mrs. Young, 560 11th Street, wife of Nolan Young, then appeared before the Council to concur with the remarks of Mr. Young, adding that the Salvation Army was generally considered a religious organization, even to the point of conducting religious services and that if such a precedent were followed other religious organizations within the area should be entitled to similar preferential treatment. She said that, in her opinion, such a policy should be discontinued on the grounds dictated by the First Constitutional amendment having to do with separating the affairs of church and state.

The Mayor gave a brief history of the Salvation Army in this area including the reason the City was obligated to relocate them, since the old location had been taken from them to provide space for the joint City-County Law Enforcement facility. The Mayor registered an opinion to the effect that the Salvation Army, although religiously motivated, is dedicated to the principle of coming to the aid and assistance of all people, local or transient, religious and non-religious and certainly with no concern for religious affiliation and in this respect, may differentiate from the conventional religious organization. The Mayor concluded his comments by saying that, by previous Council action, recognizing the obligation to properly relocate the Salvation Army, a decision had been reached whereby the Salvation Army, under an appropriate lease, would occupy the old library premises. Mrs. Young then re-appeared and urged that, this being the case, the City Attorney be directed to research the matter to determine the legality of such action. It was moved by Councilman Freeman, seconded by Campbell, that this issue be referred to the General Services Director to determine complete details pertaining to property acquisition involving the old salvation army premises and for the City Attorney for a legal opinion as proposed by Mrs. Young. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none; carried.

The City Clerk noted that a legal notice was being published, calling for a public hearing on December 22nd to consider the initial zoning of four parcels of ground, namely, Old Fashion Way, Division #1, Hatch Addition, Division #8, Park-St. Clair Addition, Division #2 and Pancheri Addition, Division #3, in the event said additions were annexed that night, and that this was being done without formal Council approval. It was moved by Councilman Campbell, seconded by Erickson, that this action be duly ratified. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none; carried.

Also in need of ratification, according to the City Clerk, was publication of a legal notice, calling for a public hearing, to be conducted on December 22nd to consider the re-zoning of Lot 18, Block 9, Hatch Addition, Division #7. It was moved by Councilman Campbell, seconded by Erickson, that this action also be ratified. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none; carried.

Another item in need of ratification was the publishing of a legal notice calling for a public hearing on December 22nd in relation to amending certain wording contained in the comprehensive zoning Ordinance No. 1115. It was moved by Councilman Campbell, seconded by Erickson, that this action be ratified. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none; carried.

Also in need of ratification was the publishing of a legal notice calling for a public hearing, conducted this night, to consider a variance that would permit the parking of vehicles in a R-2 zone. It was moved by Councilman Campbell, seconded by Erickson, that this action be duly ratified. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none; carried.

Finally, under matters requiring ratification, the City Clerk reported that she had forwarded two summons in connection with damage claims in the names of Cleave Reddick and Douglas & Joyce Wenzell and that these were mailed to the City's liability insurance carrier and the City Attorney on November 28th and December 2nd respectfully. It was moved by Councilman Freeman, seconded by Erickson, that this action taken by the City Clerk be duly ratified. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none; carried.

Bills for the month of November, 1977, having been properly audited by the Fiscal Committee, were presented. The City Clerk read aloud all fund totals for materials, services and payroll as follows:

The reasons why they are in this category are many, including the fact that the debtors are deceased or bankrupt or a skip or completely without assets.

This year's totals 399; dollar amount, \$19,158.77. Based upon total gross revenue for all utilities during 1973 in the amount of \$4,668,498.18, the percentage of charge-offs is .41 of 1%.
