

**MARCH 17, 1977**

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Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in special session in the Council Chambers on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1977, at 7:30 P.M. for the purpose of conducting public hearings for consideration of the proposed General Revenue Sharing Fund Budget and the Antirecession Fiscal Assistance Fund Budget and any other business which might be appropriately presented. There were present at said meeting: Mayor S. Eddie Pedersen, Councilmen Mel Erickson, Gil Karst, Paul Hovey, Tom Campbell, and Jim Freeman. Absent: Councilman Ralph Wood. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Arthur Smith, City Attorney; John Evans, City Controller.

The Mayor announced that this was the time and the place, as advertised, to conduct a public hearing, as required by law, to consider a proposed General Revenue Sharing Fund Budget for the nine months fiscal year ending September 30, 1977. The City Clerk presented and read aloud said proposed budget, as follows:

Councilman Karst explained that, under the new regulations, the purpose of this hearing was to hear and consider input from interested citizens as said input pertained to the expenditure of revenue sharing funds. There were none who appeared to register protest or otherwise comment on the foregoing proposed budget. It was moved by Councilman Karst, seconded by Freeman, that this hearing be concluded and closed. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, none; carried.

The Mayor then announced that this was the time and the place, as advertised, to conduct a public hearing, as required by law, to consider and hear citizens input, if any there might be, on a proposed Antirecession Fiscal Assistance Fund Budget, as follows:
