



The City of Idaho Falls, Idaho is a dynamic community of 67,723 residents located in Bonneville County. Idaho Falls is the largest city in Eastern Idaho and is the third-largest metropolitan area in the state behind the Boise City-Nampa and Coeur d'Alene metropolitan areas.

Outdoor enthusiasts love the proximity to Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks, picturesque Snake River greenbelt, relaxing natural hot springs, and fly-fishing locations on the Snake River. Idaho Falls is also the location of the Museum of Idaho, College of Eastern Idaho, and branches of Idaho State University and the University of Idaho as well as the Idaho National Laboratory.

Idaho Falls operates under a strong mayor form of government with a six-member city council. The mayor is elected every four years and presides at all meetings of the City Council and serves as the administrative head of the city. Council members are elected for staggered terms of four years. All elections are at-large and nonpartisan.

The city is truly a full-service city and includes 11 departments: Airport, City Attorney, Community Development Services, Fire, Human Resources, Idaho Falls Power, Library, Municipal Services, Parks and Recreation, Police Department, and Public Works. Idaho Falls is fortunate to control all its utilities, including electricity, water, sewer, and even fiber optics.

The total general fund adopted budget for FY 2022-2023 is \$65,728,157. The total city budget for FY 2022-23 is \$333,416,302.
