Please take notice that I have called a special meeting of the City Council of said City to be held at the City Council Rooms on the 19th day of February, 1929, at 1:00 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of considering claims, receiving reports, discussing and taking such action as is deemed necessary regarding the proposed bill in the legislature introduced by Senator Newcomb relating to municipal utilities, considering plans for the placing of sidewalk, curb and gutter on the south side of Broadway from Capital Avenue to the Snake River bridge.

There were present; Barzilla W. Clark, Mayor, E. R. Underhill, City Clerk, and Councilmen Driscoll, Ewart, Schwarz, Shattuck and Shippen, absent; Coy, Holmes and Randall, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The claim of C. T. Edwards in the amount of \$2932.00 was read and it was moved by Shattuck, seconded by Shippen, that the claim be laid on the table. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.

Two reports of the Department of Public Welfare were read and ordered filed.

At this time Councilmen Coy and Randall entered and thereafter participated in the proceedings of the Council.

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A letter from Senator M. B. Yeaman with copy of the municipality utilities bill introduced by Senator Newcomb was read and after some discussion, it was agreed that Councilman Shattuck should look after this matter in the legislature.

City Engineer Christensen presented plans and specifications for the placing of cement sidewalk, curb and gutter along the south side of Broadway from Capital Avenue to the Snake River Bridge. After some discussion, it was agreed that this work should be done by the City under force account rather than by contract.

It was moved by Shippen, seconded by Ewart, that we do now adjourn. Roll call voting aye; unanimous.
